KSU students ride local fixed routes for <u>FREE</u>! Your <u>FLASHcard</u> is your boarding pass! PA<u>RTA</u>'s express routes are affordable too. Get to <u>Akron for \$1</u> and <u>Cleveland for \$5</u>.

Be sure to download <u>EZFare</u>, our mobile ticketing app to purchase fares for these routes as well as our neighbor transit agencies.

Which route goes where?

- 51—Campus Loop: Clock-wise through the dorms, academic buildings, Student Center, and Downtown Kent
- 53—Reverse Loop: Counter clock-wise through the dorms, academic buildings, Student Center, and Downtown Kent
- 55—Allerton: Commuter service between the Allerton Sports Complex and the Student Center Allerton service will end by 9:30 p.m.
- 58—Front Campus/Summit East: Service from Dix Stadium & the Summit East Lot to Front Campus via the Student Center
- Full on-campus service begins with the start of the semester
